Dee Porter presents “The Civil War and Surry County”

Dee Porter, son of former Rotarian Doug Porter and wife Arlette, received his Master's Degree in American History from NC State University with a concentration in the American South.

Through research of letters from private collections; documents from state, federal, and university archives; and exhaustive newspaper searches, Mr. Porter presented an interesting program on how the Civil War affected the citizens of Surry County. It was a time of extreme hardship, starvation and disease. Though Surry County was far from the battlefield, local residents encountered military operations and witnessed the brutality of war in their own backyards.

Beginning in the fall, Dee will begin work on his doctorate in Southern History at the University of Mississippi (Ole Miss).

Habitat for Humanity

From humble beginnings sixteen years ago Habitat for Humanity in Mount Airy is coming on strong. Over those past 16 years, 26 new homes have been constructed. Early on it was a challenge to find folks needing the assistance Habitat for Humanity could provide, but due to current economic conditions those numbers are increasing.

Tim VanHoy is the Director, with Jenny Anderson as Community Coordinator and Melissa Tickle as the Re-Store Manager. The store brings in enough funding to cover overhead which allows contributions to be used in full for home building. While the homes are geared for a particular family, the typical home is 1,100 square feet; three bedrooms; combined kitchen, dining, living area; and one bathroom.

Sad Announcement

On Friday, July 31 Tim passed away at Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem. Our condolences go out to Tim's family and all those who knew and loved him. Tim set an example by doing work that helped and encouraged others. His passing leaves a hole in our community that cannot be easily replaced.

There is a laundry room that could be converted to a bathroom if the need is there.

General requirements include 60-70% of median income or roughly \$28,000 for a family of 4; 20 year mortgage; and 200 hours of sweat equity (100 hours on their own home and 100 hours on another home being built).

Also featured is Kids Rock Yard, a kid's game area. Food, wine and beer, and sodas will be available for purchase. Tickets are \$10.00 for ages 11 and up, under 11 free.
