THE MIRACLE WORK OF THE AMERICAN CANCER SOCIETY



Giny Haynes visited with us recently and provided some encouraging information regarding cancer. There are 11,000,000 cancer survivors celebrating another birthday. People have learned that early detection can be the difference between life and death and more and more people are opting for preventive examinations.

The ACS first began research in 1946. Over \$3.2B dollars have been given to fund research programs to find treatments. Last year there were 44 research grants awarded in North Carolina. Locally 5 grants went to Wake Forest University and 1 grant to Wake Forest University Baptist Medical Center. These grants totaled \$20 million. When you participate in the Relay for Life events and other fundraising opportunities you are helping do make these grants possible.

If you or someone you know would like to help with patient transportation needs, check out the Road to Recovery Program. Volunteers transport patients to and from their doctor appointments and treatments. For many patients without other resources this is the only hope they have.
