solvency. "Let me put into simple terms, the challenge that is in front of us. This year, we will end our fiscal year which is Sept. 30. As a country we will spend \$3.7 Trillion dollars. We will collect \$2.2 Trillion leaving us a shortfall of \$1.5 Trillion." As we can see, this problem is so large most of us can't even imagine what this means. He further went on to state that eliminating all discretionary spending and eliminated all expense relating to our national defense we would still be \$200 Billion shy of paying off the debt.

He does have feelings of optimism because we as a nation have always pulled together when the need was there and that time has certainly come. He further stated that North Carolina is attractive to businesses looking to expand and in fact there are more companies looking at North Carolina than he has seen in 17 years. These companies, on average, are looking to invest \$1 Billion or more in our state. One of the prime reasons for looking here is the large pool of graduates from colleges and universities. An educated workforce is of prime importance and as a state we have built an excellent school system for higher learning.

He went on to talk about numerous other topics that must be addressed by our leaders. We encourage all our elected officials to take the long look at what is best for this country and make the decisions that must be made to keep us not only relevant, but still a major power in the global economy.

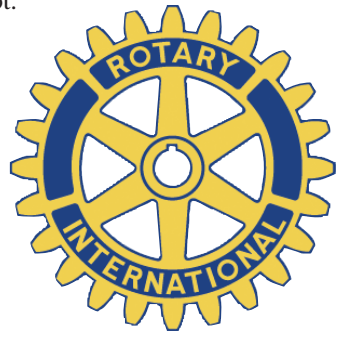


Welcome New Member Ray Milian

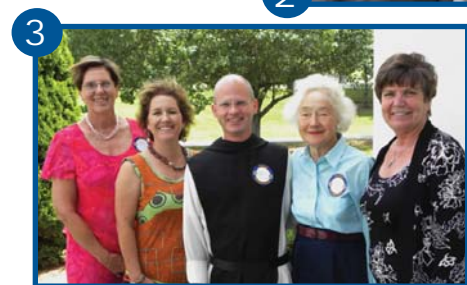
Enviromental Clean-up Day—Sept. 10
