How to Earn 5 Championship Rings

There are 5 things Rich spelled out that can help each of us achieve that goal.

1. Always do the right thing.

Honesty and integrity speak volumes about who you are, and trust is a key component in building a championship character. Do what's right even when no one is looking.

2. Become a person of value.

Be positive – Stay focused on your goals and stay on the right path.
Be persistent – Don't let minor setbacks get you down and don't give up.

3. Practice courage with small victories.

5. Practice random acts of kindness.
