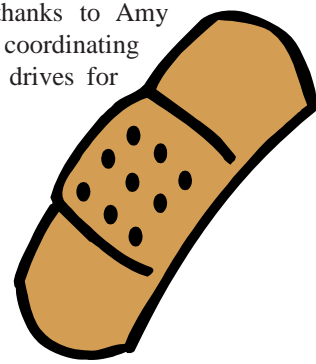

24 Pints Collected

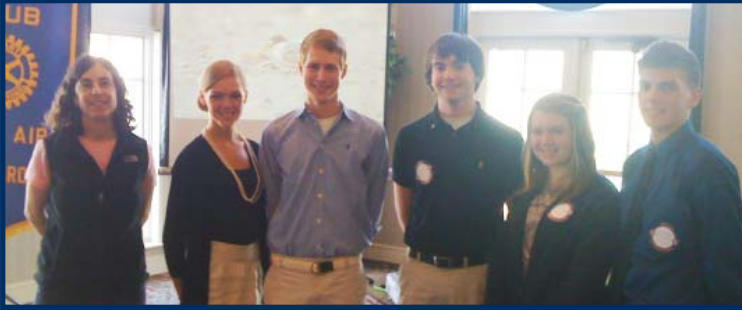

Protecting our Precious Birds— Ida Phillips, Director of Communications Audubon of North Carolina

Who knew so many species of birds actually nest on the sands of our beautiful beaches to hatch their eggs and bring new life to our coast. Ida Phillips presented an interesting talk about how the Audubon organization is changing their methods to better educate the public about coastal birds. Children from Wrightsville Beach Elementary School submitted art work depicting birds of the coast and asking for help in protecting them and their nesting areas. There is a balance to be found between nature, man and development and Audubon North Carolina is working with many people to find that place.

Volunteers work daily along the coast recording the nesting areas and watching over the birds from early spring into the hot summer. The birds hollow out a place in the sand to lay their eggs to hatch. If you see an area roped or marked off, please be respectful of the birds. Allow them the space needed to bring little ones into the world so that we may continue to watch them soar through the sky and dart about for food. Watching birds at the beach is part of the whole experience and we can each help that process along by being watchful.

One of the projects of the Mount Airy High School Interact-Venture Club was collecting Dawn Dishwashing Detergent to be sent to the Gulf. There are still birds covered in oil. Their health and the health of the flock can be improved by the continued efforts of those volunteers who capture and wash the birds.

Gang Activity - Can It Happen Here?

The answer is yes. While Mount Airy doesn't have any formal "gangs" there are young folks involved in activities that could push them in that direction. Patrick Merrill is a police officer in Winston-Salem who works exclusively with the 80 schools in Forsyth County covering gangs.

The reasons are many for why a young boy or girl would join a gang, but one predominate reason is the need for belonging and feeling important. Many of these children are from single family homes where the father is absent and the

mother is working or not at home. Money is tight; structure and discipline may be non-existent; and the need to connect to others is a motivating factor.

Gangs are harsh, dead-end, and sometimes deadly enterprises to belong to. There are many ways to recognize gang involvement or the potential for gang association. The signs can be tattoos; color and style of clothing; how the clothing is worn; drawings and writings.
